


# Loch Raven High School Summer Reading 2020

The book for this program is *Dear Martin* by Nic Stone. It is available to borrow as both an eBook and an audiobook through the Baltimore County Public Library (BCPL).



*Dear Martin* follows the story of Justyce McAllister, a teenager who grapples with social injustice. In an effort to make sense of and change the world around him, he starts a journal to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

After reading *Dear Martin*, compose or create a reflection. Your reflection should address the following:

1. Did you like or dislike the book? Why?
2. If you were going to write a letter to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. sharing your own thoughts about and experiences in American society, what would you say?
3. What other thoughts, feelings, or questions came up for you while reading?

You may submit your reflection as a written response, video or audio recording, or piece of art. If you choose to create a piece of art, you should include a written explanation.

Submit your reflection to your English teacher by October 9<sup>th</sup> in order to be invited to our celebration/discussion and entered into the prize raffle!
